So, another great month for us all in R&D! I'm pleased to say our end of year total for our accruals in 2023/2024 is 3246 patients, so another year where we have recruited more than 3000 patients a year. VERY WELL DONE EVERYONE. This makes it 9 consecutive years where we have accrued more than 3000 patients into clinical trials in a year!

We have submitted several NIHR grants with colleagues on a variety of subjects, and we have had six of our staff invited to attend the academic writing retreat at York St John, run by Oxford University, which is a great opportunity for them.

We have had our funding confirmed by the Clinical Research Network, they have informed us that it will stay static this year as its transitions into the Research Delivery Service (hoisted by Leeds). They have also requested we strive to achieve 3500 accruals this year, but with the Babi study now live that should be achievable.
