The BDA GET can award grants to any research so long as the outcome 'advances the science and practice of dietetics' and meets the other criteria in the terms and guidance.

Funding is therefore available for a wide range of dietetic research and can be used to fund:

- Running costs
- Project costs
- Help with salaries

There is no set limit to the amount GET fund, grants have typically been awarded for research projects in the range of £5,000-£40,000.

We recognise that having the time, space, support and funding to start your research activity can be a challenge, especially for early career researchers and it is these individuals for whom the new award is intended. Awards are available for $\pounds 500 - \pounds 5,000$ for activities such as writing a proposal, carrying out a small-scale study, buying-in specialist skills, convening a support group or network, writing a paper that enhances your research profile, etc.
