

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES, GRANTS, AND SCHEMES

NIHR 2025 Academic Clinical Fellowships in Medicine – This is a clinical specialty training post in medicine that incorporates academic training. The post has a standard duration of 3 years (up to 4 years for GPs). As an ACF you will have access to Masters-level research training to develop academic skills and spend 25% of your time in research or educationalist training. NIHR Public Health Research Programme (Future Topics) – The NIHR are due to release their Public Health Research Programmes, which will consider: unstructured physical activity for children, interventions to reduce violence, citizens advice, children and young people's mental health, health impacts of messages in the media, community wealth (asses) building, and coastal details. Paul Brittain attended the Action on Smoking and Health inaugural meeting in Parliament to back the Tobacco and Vapes Bill this month. Smoking survivors and bereaved families heard from the Minister for Public Health on the Government's bold plans to create a Smokefree country. This includes re-introducing the Tobacco and Vapes Bill to Parliament which will raise the age of sale annually, ensuring no one born after 2009 will ever be legally be sold tobacco, alongside measures to curb youth vaping.
